LHSPLA Official's Dress Code

LHSPLA Officials with less than 5 years of experience must wear khaki dress pants with a blue LHSPLA Official's polo with the LHSPLA logo on the left chest, a pair of comfortable brown or black dress shoes – no tennis shoes, and solid brown or black belt. This dress code is required for all officials.

LHSPLA Officials with more than 5 years of experience have the option of wearing the appropriate LHSPLA vest with the LHSPLA Official's logo on the left chest, a white oxford shirt, and tie. Female officials are not required to wear a tie. Officials are required to wear khaki dress pants, a pair of comfortable brown or black dress shoes – no tennis shoes, and a solid brown or black belt.

5+ years of experience	Blue LHSPLA Vest
20+ years of experience	Red LHSPLA Vest
Hall of Fame Member	Khaki LHSPLA Vest

New Officials will be able to purchase an LHSPLA Official's Polo from the Director of Officials/Assignment Secretary for \$25. For accounting purposes, LHSPLA Officials will not be allowed to pay for any new LHSPLA Official's Polo by deducting the cost of the shirt from their meet stipend.

Improperly attired officials will receive warnings and will be made aware of uniform violations at the Invitational/Dual Meet level. Any Official who fails to comply with the LHSPLA Officials dress code at the Regional Level will be fined accordingly having the following amounts deducted from their meet stipends:

Improper Pants - \$10.00 Improper Shoes - \$5.00 Improper Belt - \$5.00

All fines for improper dress must be paid in full before a certified LHSPLA Official will be allowed to work at any one of the LHSAA/LHSPLA State Powerlifting Meets. If a Certified LHSPLA Official shows up to officiate at the LHSAA/LHSPLA State Powerlifting Meet with any dress code violation, he/she will not be allowed to officiate at the meet and will not be reimbursed for any expenses incurred travelling to the meet venue to work the meet. They will have the option of correcting the dress code violation and can be reinstated to officiate at the LHSAA/LHSPLA State Powerlifting Meet at half their regular stipend.
